In academics, the school-wide Spelling Bee returned and had many competing for recognition. The students and teachers worked hard together in preparation for provincial testing and their efforts were rewarded with much success. The monthly awards to skills and values each month became a time to showcase athletics with team competitions and community entrepreneurs. The year closed with three graduations - for our Kindergarten crew at their onset, for the Grade 8's as they transition to High School, and for the Grade 12's moving forward to post-secondary campuses.

In our extra-curricular programs, we added three theme dance nights, an art show, and many clubs. We also had the largest cohort of campers attend our annual outdoor education excursion. Field trips were many and varied, with Escape Rooms, Ninja Fit Obstacle Courses, Museum Tours, and Multi-cultural Meals.

Very importantly, we ended the 2022/23 year in a very purposeful and all-encompassing transition to the next - we are celebrating the renewal of our *Entrepreneurship program* and planning with excitement its potential to impact learning for our students in many ways.
