About Us

Footprints for Learning Academy (FFLA) is a charitable, nonprofit, private school in Airdrie, Alberta. We currently provide Kindergarten to Grade 12 education for students in Alberta as regulated and defined by the Government of Alberta's Education School Act and as per the Government of Alberta's definition of an accredited funded Private School.

Our school opened its doors in 2011/2012, with community and parent support, and offered a Kindergarten class of 19 students. By 2013/2014 we had expanded to a full K-7 school, in a brand new building, and were full to capacity (225 students) with a large waitlist. Over the past 10 years we have continued to grow and currently offer a dynamic, interactive, student-centered program for 477 students in grades K-12 with 2 campuses (both located in our small community of Airdrie).

FFLAs educational community is focused entirely on the best education possible for each learner - one based on excellence, on fundamentals mastery, and on personalization. One also grounded in a philosophy that values both the global and growth mindsets in their inherent sense of respect, responsibility and resourcefulness, allowing the students to ACHIEVE, EXPLORE, and EXCEL. Our goal is to provide the means to enable each student to become an enthusiastic, engaged, and effective learner within the greater community of learners and over a lifetime of new experiences.

Mission and Vision








Literacy Program

Literacy learning begins in the home and community as children listen to language in conversation, literature and media and where they learn to speak, view and represent their first circle of words. It continues to build on that foundation in school where literacy should be a balanced menu of activities to stimulate, teach, and extend the learner's development of communication and thinking skills.

A unique addition to our literacy programming is the inclusion of the D'Nealian cursive method. Our students learn to work with words and develop their writing, reading and handwriting skills daily and cross-circularly.



Science Program

At FFLA, we believe in the value of Project and Inquiry-Based Learning, most especially within our Science Classroom. In such, we follow Alberta Education program of Studies in all levels of learning from Elementary to High School – to determine what knowledge and skills outcomes we will study. We then explore each topic through student directed practices (e.g. demonstrations, simulations, experiments, modelling, visualization, and field trips) so that the curricular lessons unfold in a circle of understandings that are tied to the learners' interests and questions.

We celebrate our students achievements and learning with a school-wide Science Fair each year. We were thrilled to be able to host an in person event again this year! Over 70 students participated and set up their projects in our gym for everyone to see.



Social Studies Program

The FFLA Social Studies program aligns directly with the Alberta Education Program of Studies. Learning in Social Studies is related to the core concepts of citizenship and identity and is achieved through focused content at each grade level.

Global Awareness is an additional area of study that we have incorporated into our K-12 social studies program. We believe it is important to learn about all seven continents on this earth, with an added focus on geography. It is a weekly block of time where students trek across the globe to become familiar with its lands, waters, flora, and fauna. This is designed as extension to the Lands, Places, and Peoples strand of Alberta's Social Studies Program of Study and is intended to grow our global understandings to those cultures found both inside and outside of our immediate community.

Math Program

At FFLA we have a unique approach to Mathematics and have blended the recommended Alberta Education resources (e.g. Math Makes Sense) with Math U See and other innovative resources like Khan Academy to find the ideal BALANCE for learning math.


By including all of these methods in our classrooms we ensure that our math program aligns with Alberta Education's curriculum but also offers our students more flexibility and independence in their learning pace. Mastery is the key to our approach and each individual student must master a concept before moving onto the next.

In our planning we also highlight the need in numeracy studies to be touched upon in all curricula (e.g. Entrepreneurship) to discover the value of numbers, the meaning of equations, and how to problem solve both logically and creatively in the real world.

Entrepreneurship Program

In addition to all of the core subjects and electives at FFLA we also offer an entrepreneurship program to provide an economic edge to our learning. This will prepare our students to graduate with business skills, economic understanding and financial literacy.

We have partnered with Jr. Achievement Canada (JA), BizWorld (BW), and use the National Content Standards for Entrepreneurship Education (NCSEE). We created an FFLA Entrepreneurship Curriculum for our school that will prepare our students for the 'work world' and provide them with knowledge and skills sets that will enable them to achieve their goals and aspirations.









Languages Program

We include two different language studies programs for our students - Spanish for grades K-12 and French for grades 4-6, with an added option for a continuation in grades 7-12.

These learning opportunities align with the FFLA agenda towards Global Mindedness and provide another platform for literacy enhancement.

At FFLA, our students are immersed in the Spanish language program starting in Kindergarten and continues through all grade levels. We use Total Physical Response (TPR) and Total Physical Response Story Telling (TPRS) to teach our students Spanish as a second language. The main goal in our Spanish classrooms is to utilize comprehensible input with a focus on the verbs, in order to help our students become proficient in understanding, reading, writing, and eventually speaking their new language.

In addition to the in-class Spanish learning we provide our FFLA middle school students with the opportunity for a 10-day cultural, humanitarian and Spanish language immersion experience by traveling to a Spanish speaking country. It is during this trip that students not only learn about the culture but they learn to serve others globally. We are hopeful that we will be able to resume our travels in the 2023/2024 school year!



Athletics Program

FFLA believes that strong physical education and extracurricular athletics programs are essential to a balanced and quality education. That is why our K-12 classes receive daily physical activity. We have Physical Education classes in a large gym or mini-gym with climbers, intramurals and electives with rotating team sports, and multiple extracurricular athletics programs.

Students can participate in our extra-curricular athletics program at our Jr. High (Grades 6-9), Junior Varsity (Grade 10), and Senior Varsity (Grade 10/11/12) levels. All of FFLA's athletic programs are offered through ASAA's South Central Zone and the CAAA. For our Varsity program, certain sports are offered directly from FFLA and others are offered in partnership with Bert Church High School.

This past year was one of incredible growth in our athletics programming. We had our Jr. High teams all back up and running with record numbers of students who joined the various teams! Our FFLA Foxes represented our school incredibly throughout the year in Cross Country, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton and Soccer. Our Sr. High students who chose to join teams also excelled in Football, Golf and Badminton!





Music and Drama Program

At FFLA, we believe that Music and Drama are essential components of a balanced education. These arts provide opportunities for students to discover and express their own abilities to create and contribute individually and as a group. We take our Music and Drama program seriously and as such we have an experienced and dedicated specialist teacher who engages students with thematic productions each year.

In December, our grade 1-4 classes filmed another virtual holiday concert that was shared digitally with all of our FFLA families.

While in May our grades 4-6 students proudly took to the stage for our spring musical Suessical! It was a colorful, creative and entertaining show.

What is your plan now that you have completed high school? I will be working for this coming year and applying to schools.


What is a favourite memory of your time at FFLA? Going on our overnight camping trip with Ms. Holland. We had a lot of fun.
